# HOCKING ALUM KICKS HIS WAY INTO THE SPOTLIGHT

When Kansei Matsuzawa enrolled at Hocking College in 2019, he had never played football before. In fact, he had only just started kicking months earlier, teaching himself the basics by watching YouTube videos. What he lacked in experience, he more than made up for with determination.

At Hocking, Matsuzawa found his stride as a kicker, even connecting on a 50-yard field goal during his sophomore season. His time as a Hawk put him on the path toward one of the most inspirational journeys in college football.

After transferring to the University of Hawaii, Matsuzawa continued to shine. In 2024, he became the Rainbow Warriors' starting placekicker, finishing the season 12-for-16 on field goals and a perfect 32-for-32 on extra points.

This fall, he captured national attention after nailing a 38-yard game-winning field goal to lift Hawaii over Stanford in the season opener. The moment represented years of hard work, perseverance, and the relentless mindset he carried with him as a student-athlete in Nelsonville.

Matsuzawa's story has been shared by national media, but for us at Hocking, it represents something even more meaningful: proof that talent and drive begin here. His success is a reminder that with dedication, opportunities extend far beyond the classroom or the field.

# HOCKING ALUM LARRY JOHNSON REFLECTS ON A LIFE OF SERVICE AND LEARNING

Larry Johnson, a Cleveland native and 1984 graduate of Hocking College's EMT-Paramedic Program, still remembers the quiet campus, outdoor opportunities, and small-college atmosphere that made Hocking special.

One of his fondest memories came in 1984, when he was chosen as one of 13 students and faculty to study abroad for two weeks. The group visited St. John's & St. Mary's Institute of Technology in Taipei, Taiwan, and The



Metropolitan College of Technology in Tokyo, Japan. He also recalls experiences unique to Hocking – water rescue training, rappelling, the annual Paul Bunyan Show, and the chance to know nearly everyone on campus.

"I even remember people talking about how shiny the floors looked in the main building," Johnson said with a smile. "What they didn't know was that my work-study job was cleaning and buffing those floors every night."

After graduating from Hocking, Johnson enlisted in the U.S. Air Force and was stationed at Andrews Air Force Base in Washington, D.C. There, he worked in the Emergency Department at Malcolm Grow Medical Center, building on the skills he learned at Hocking

Following his service, Johnson moved to Columbus, where he earned a nursing degree from The Ohio State University in 1992. Over the course of his career, he has worked in Nursing Management, the Emergency Department, Intensive Care Unit, Obstetrics and Gynecology, and the Post Anesthesia Care Unit.

Since 2021, Johnson has served on the Hocking College Foundation Board of Directors. He lives in Columbus with his wife, Tracy, their son, Preston, and their dog, Lola. His daughter, Emily, is a student at Kent State University.


# CANAL CAR SHOW & STREET CRUISE ROLLS INTO HOCKING COLLEGE
